Dear Parents and Carers,

We are very much looking forward to welcoming our students in September for their test at the time allocated for your child's form. Please see my letter dated 21st July for confirmation of your child's allotted time for their lateral flow tests.

Once your child has completed their test, they will bring home a registration form, with a barcode on it. Below is an example of the form your child will be bringing home:

Important: make sure you register online before your test or you will not get your results.
You'll need to enter the **test site ID** (see the posters or ask staff). It takes about 5 to 10 minutes to register.
Please keep this card as a record of your test.

Once your child brings their individual card home, we ask that you log onto the website address given on the card (www.gov.uk/enter-lateral-flow-test) and then either scan the QR code or register the individual barcode on your child's card.

Once you have logged the barcode, you will be asked to enter our site's ID which is: **FCHS**.

There then follows questions relating to our school's location, and some personal details related to date of birth, address etc for your child. One of the questions is centered around the date and

time of the test your child has taken, which you enter accordingly. The results service will work regardless of the fact you are registering the card details after the actual test. Thank you in advance for your support with this process.

I know there have been some queries related to the fact that we are keeping Year 7 on site on the day they have their second test and some parents have asked of the steps involved should anyone receive a positive test result. Year 7 forms are being tested in 20-minute slots for their second test and will then be shown to the playground. The students will have a half hour wait on the playground as test results are known after 30 minutes. Should any one receive a positive result, we can discreetly speak to them and contact home before their form group goes into form rooms.

Thank you again for your help and cooperation with this process. I know this testing process and the induction of our students will be smooth and effective with your support and cooperation.
